The Eternal Impact of Vacation Bible School

I remember them – Mrs. Edith and Mrs. Hart. They taught my young boys Vacation Bible School class at Bristol Baptist Church. Over 50 years later I still remember them. I don't remember the MVP of the Super Bowl or the NBA during that year. But I remember my VBS teachers. They made a difference in my life and helped me in my journey to Jesus Christ.

Vacation Bible School (VBS) is a long-standing tradition for Baptist churches. It is a powerful tool for evangelism and discipleship that plays a critical role in the spiritual development of children. It also strengthens the body of Christ by helping us reach the next generation.

At its core, VBS is about introducing children to Jesus Christ. Many children who attend VBS come from unchurched families. For some, it may be their first exposure to the truth of Scripture and the message of salvation. Through VBS Bible lessons children are taught who God is, what He has done through Jesus Christ, and how they can respond in faith. Salvation becomes a life-changing reality for many through VBS.

The lessons learned at VBS often stick with children for a lifetime. The memory verses, Bible stories, songs, and the relationships formed during this time feed a growing understanding of the Gospel. This helps anchor a child in Scripture and prepare them for future spiritual challenges.

But VBS also energizes and mobilizes the church. It provides an opportunity for members of all ages to serve together —whether through teaching, decorating, preparing snacks, recreation or other areas. This cultivates a spirit of unity and purpose that renews the church's mission focus and grows our heart for outreach.

In addition, VBS is a bridge to our community. Families who might never step foot in a Sunday service are often willing to bring their children to VBS. As relationships are developed many of these families will take steps toward deeper involvement in the church. VBS can be the first door into the church, both for children and their parents.

In an increasingly secular culture where children are constantly bombarded with conflicting messages, the need for faithful, Christ-centered VBS programs is greater than ever. The church must see VBS not as a routine summer event, but as a divine opportunity to fulfill the Great Commission among its youngest and most ready mission field.

Every song sung, every craft made, every lesson taught has the potential to echo into eternity. When the church invests in VBS, it invests in the kingdom of God—planting seeds of salvation, nurturing young disciples, and building up the body of Christ for generations to come. When you serve in VBS you will make a difference that children will remember! So let us embrace VBS with passion, prayer, and purpose and make an eternal impact.
